A Hard Day at School

Learning Objective: Students will gain practice in expressing routines and frustrating experiences at school.

Before Class: Review lesson plan and packet content. Make copies as necessary.

Materials Needed: 'Picture story' envelopes 2 mini white boards

- Arrange 'Picture story' envelopes and set up on table for 'Warm-up' activity
- Write the questions for 'They do' on 2 mini white boards. Hide until time for activity

15 minutes Warm-up Activity

- Let students work individually or pairs to arrange 'Picture story' to 'tell a story'
- Let them explain to each other why certain cards go before others

10 minutes I do/We do activity

- Ask each student or pairs to explain to explain their story
- Show the two cartoons and ask where these kids are going
- Present the questions on the mini white boards
- Using the picture story as the example, ask the students the questions

20 minutes

They do activity: Students pair up and discuss their personal experiences about a difficult day at school, school routine or subject.

• Students are **not** required to write down their answers, but for students who learn better visually (reading and writing inclined), they should be encouraged to do so.

• Once students have shared, let them introduce their partners to the class and tell in <u>brief</u> what happened in their partners' frustrating experiences

10-15 minutes Journal Writing: *Students will write in their dialog journals on one of the four options:*

- Respond to the teacher's response (continue the 'dialog' from the last entry)
- Introduce yourself to the teacher (for students new to the group)
- Why do you go to school for English? Do other people in your family go to school? What do you like best about school
- Free write about a topic of the student's choice
- 1. **Tell** about a hard day at school.
- 2. What happened?
- **3. When** was this difficult experience?
- **4. Who** was involved?
- 5. **How** did you solve the problem (How did this day end?)


Questions for They do activity, along with additional questions or They do.
