Conversation Curriculum

Gender Roles

Learning Objective: Students will be able to express their opinions about what roles are appropriate for men and women and discuss them with other students in a supportive, nonjudgmental environment.

Before class: Review lesson plan and packet content. Make copies as necessary.

• Grab 3 paper cups for 'They do' activity

15 minutes Warm-up activity: Lay out several copies of a picture story of woman going to work while husband stays at home (Comment on lesson: Where is the picture story??)

• Students will pair up or work in groups to put the picture story in order and discuss what is going on.

10 minutes I do/ We do activity: Ask student what happens in the story, model the sequence language. (What happens first? What happens second? What happens next? Then what happens? What happens last?)

- Teacher: Pass out the set of pictures for 'They do'
- Model 'They do' with class by writing a question and answering it.

20 minutes They do activity: "Coffee Talk"

• **Teacher:** set out paper cups and put set of conversation questions into each cup. Separate by level.

• Students pair up, pull out question, pose to their partners and answer the question themselves

*Teacher may facilitate by joining in student conversations, posing follow-up questions, and clearing up any misunderstandings that occur.

10 – 15 minutes Journal Writing: *Students write in their dialog journal about one of the four options:*

- Respond to the teacher's response (i.e. continue the 'dialog' from the last entry)
- Introduce yourself to the teacher (for new students)
- Free write about a topic of your choice
- How are men and women different? Do these differences matter?

If men and women are in a family together, does it matter who has a job? Is it better for women

to have a job? Is it better for men to have a job?
