Celebrations	Skill Focus: Talk and read about getting together with friends and family. Can the learner without help? Name each of the new vocabulary words pictured. Read (decode) each of the new vocabulary words. Form a full sentence about a celebration. (Eg, We cook together.) Say months and calendar dates. Read a party invitation.	cook, eat, visit, play games, clean up Mexico, happy, graveyard, candles, November, family, food, sing	-ay (play), -ame (game) -ead (dead), -ied (died)
Community Places	Skill Focus: Request a library card, say and write address, read store hours. Can the learner without help? Name each of the new vocabulary words pictured. Read (decode) each of the new vocabulary words. Form a full sentence about places around town. Say their address and zip code clearly. Read a store hours sign.	park, library, grocery store, mechanic, clinic city, laundromat, directions map, near, across from, wash, park	-ic (clinic), -ore (store) -ap (map), -ark (park)



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Daily Activities	Skill Focus: Talk and read about a daily schedule. Can the learner without help? Name each of the new vocabulary words pictured. Read (decode) each of the new vocabulary words. Form a full sentence about parts of the day (morning, afternoon). Say parts of the day and days of the week. Read a schedule.	morning, afternoon, evening, tomorrow, week warehouse, drive, eat, sleep, wake up, kids, dinner, tired	-an (can), -eet (meet) -ive (drive), -ired (tired)
Health Problems	Skill Focus: Give simple personal information to a doctor. Can the learner without help? Name each of the new vocabulary words pictured. Read (decode) each of the new vocabulary words Form a full sentence about what hurts: My stomach hurts. Say and Spell their first name, last name clearly enough to be given over the phone. Write personal information on a medical form.	stomach, chest, head, throat, back grandmother, sick, throw up, water, stomach, school, teacher, home	-est (chest), -ack (back) -ick (sick), -ow (throw)



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Home Problems	Skill Focus: Call to report a needed repair. Can the learner without help? Name each of the new vocabulary words pictured. Read (decode) each of the new vocabulary words. Form a full sentence about a household item that is not working. Say their first name, last name and phone number clearly enough to leave a phone message. Read an analog clock on the hour and half hour.	smoke alarm, heat, toilet, hot water, air conditioner sleep, alarm, loud, light, fire, smoke, night, battery	-ot (hot), -eat (heat) -eep (sleep), -ight (night)
Making Plans with Friends	Skill Focus: Talk and read about the weather. Can the learner without help? Name each of the new vocabulary words pictured. Read (decode) each of the new vocabulary words. Form a full sentence about the weather. (Eg, It is rainy.) Say the temperature using "degrees." Read a thermometer and a text message.	rainy, snowy, sunny, cloudy, windy party, time, address, outside, weather, rainy, text, sunny	-un (sun), -ain (rain) -ime (time), -ide (outside)



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Medicine Labels	Skill Focus: Talk and read about medicine labels. Can the learner without help? Name each of the new vocabulary words pictured. Read (decode) each of the new vocabulary words. Form a full sentence about taking medicine. Say how much and how often to take medicine. Read a medicine label.	tablet, pill, capsule, dose, tablespoon clinic, son, doctor, sore throat, heart, medicine, pharmacy (tablet)	-ill (pill), -each (each) -ore (sore), -oat (throat)
Our Classroom	Skill Focus: Talk and read about the classroom. Can the learner without help? Name each of the new vocabulary words pictured. Read (decode) each of the new vocabulary words. Form a full sentence about actions in the classroom. Say dates and dates of birth. Read a registration form.	listen, read, say, write, spell English, question, paycheck, holiday, school, partner, computer, study	-ay (say), -ite (write) -ish (English), -ool (school)



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Sharing Food	Skill Focus: Talk and read about food and food preparation. Can the learner without help? Name each of the new vocabulary words pictured. Read (decode) each of the new vocabulary words. Form a full sentence about what you need for cooking. Say numbers 1-10; use "How much?" and "How many? Read a recipe.	eggs, sugar, cup, bowl, spoon cook, recipe, mix, flour, salt, batter, plantains, fry	-eed (need), -oon (spoon) -ook (cook), -ix (mix)
Shopping for Clothes	Skill Focus: Talk and read about clothing. Can the learner without help? Name each of the new vocabulary words pictured. Read (decode) each of the new vocabulary words. Form a full sentence using clothing names. Say clothing sizes. Read clothing labels and an order form.	shirt, pants, shoes, skirt, sweater clothes, pants, socks, shirts, boots, prices, shipping, online	-eed (need), -irt (shirt) -ip (ship), -op (shop)



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Talking at Work	Skill Focus: Talk and read about work schedules; ask for more hours. Can the learner without help? Name each of the new vocabulary words pictured. Read (decode) each of the new vocabulary words. Form a full sentence using "can/cannot work" within a time frame. Say work schedules (part-time; full-time, etc.). Read a job change-of-hours form.	part-time, full-time, days, evenings, weekends cashier, groceries, boss, people, form (part-time), (full-time), (evenings)	-art (part), -ull (full) -oss (boss), -orm (form)
Working with Money	Skill Focus: Talk and read about money. Can the learner without help? Name each of the new vocabulary words pictured. Read (decode) each of the new vocabulary words. Form a full sentence about how much something costs. Say names of bakery items, coins and dollars. Read a receipt.	bread, cake, cookie, donut, pie, (penny, nickel, dime, quarter, cents) bakery, bread, busy, hire, order, talk, money, happy	-ake (cake), -ut (donut) -ire (hire), -alk (talk)
