Objectives

After the unit, learners will be able to:

- 1. Discuss the concept of "storytelling" and its varied roles across cultures.
- Read and navigate a table of contents, activating prior knowledge, making predictions about content and locating key information in a text. (CCRS RI.2.5) (TIF LS 1a, 1b)
- Identify and analyze examples of literary genres in *Journeys*. Identify the main purpose of a text, including what the author wants to answer, explain or describe. (CCRS R1.2.6) (TIF CT 1b)
- Read Journeys texts aloud with fluency, focusing on appropriate speed, accuracy and expression after successive readings. (CCRS RF.4)
- Compare and contrast Journeys texts of the same genre using graphic organizers. (CCRS RI.3.9) (TIF CT Ic)
- 6. Use a personal response journal to synthesize and reflect on Journeys texts. (TIF CT 1c)
- Write a Journeys-style narrative text, using a prewriting/rough draft/final draft process. (CCRS W.2.3, W.3.4, W.3.5)







About Journeys

Journeys is a collection of writings published annually by Minnesota Literacy Council. Each fall, Adult Basic Education learners from across the state prepare and submit their original stories, poetry and artwork for publication in the spring.

Journeys is a book of stories. Within its pages, you'll find memories, poems, art, tall tales and everything in between. These stories share the journeys and perspectives of adult literacy students enrolled in reading, English as a Second Language, GED, and basic skills classes across the state of Minnesota.

Many studies suggest that culturally relevant texts help increase students' engagement in learning. *Journeys* provides a text of authentic learner stories for teachers to use in the classroom. We believe *Journeys* engages students more effectively than other texts because it values the contributions adult students make to adult education programs and the larger Minnesota community.

Whether you are a teacher, tutor, supporter of literacy education or simply believe in the power of words, you will find yourself connecting to the stories in *Journeys* because one thing is certain: you are on your own journey. We all are. Hearing the stories of fellow travelers and learning about the struggles and victories they've had along the way, however similar or dissimilar they may be to our own, helps us to better navigate the world and find our place within it.





Eligibility:

- Author or artist must be enrolled in an Adult Basic Education program in Minnesota.
- All submissions must be original material.
- Only one submission per person will be considered. Submissions that are not selected for publication must be resubmitted to be considered for the next edition.
- Literacy Minnesota reserves the right to edit and/or exclude submissions. Submissions not included in the book may be published on our website.
- Submission length should be 400 words or less.

Submission Requirements – Written Work:

- Written works must be submitted via webform: literacymn.org/journeys-2021
- Email or USPS submissions will not be accepted.
- Submit a separate webform for each student. Only one submission per student.
- As part of the *Journeys* book production process, edits may be made for comprehension, clarity and spelling.

Submission Requirements – Art Work:

- Submit the original.
- Include the **Journeys Artwork Submission Form** (next page), with all areas completed. Send art entries to the address on the Artwork Submission Form.
- If the original is not available, contact Kelly Rynda, krynda@literacymn.org, to inquire about acceptable alternate formats.
- Pen and ink drawings are encouraged, as they scan to print quality more easily than other media.




"Letters About Literature" Special Submission Guidelines:

- 1. Select a fiction or nonfiction book, short story, poem, essay or speech (excluding song lyrics) that you have read and which has impacted you.
- 2. Imagine sitting down with the author of this work and sharing your personal thoughts. Your letter should be personal and sincere, more like a private conversation than a book report or fan letter.
- Share specific details both about the work and about your reaction to the work. Write honestly and from your own perspective.
- 4. Keep in mind that this is a reflective writing contest. Think about what you read and the meaning you gleaned from the author's words.
- 5. Type your letter, which should be between 400-600 words.
- 6. Make sure your letter includes a date, greeting, body, closing, and your name or signature. Please do not include a return address on your letter.
- 7. Submit your letter using the *Journeys* 2021 submission webform.
- 8. Stay tuned for more details about the "Letters About Literature" contest.
